



General Terms and Conditions: The EANO Fellowship Scheme

Introduction

The European Association of Neuro-oncology (EANO) Fellowship is intended to support Members [or junior workers supported by Members] who wish to undertake training or collaborative research in a different country from that of the applicant.

The Fellowship comprises a 'one off' payment of 23,500 Euros to cover travel and accommodation costs paid to the applicant plus a single payment of 7,500 Euros to cover running costs for the project to be paid to the host institute. Copies of receipts/accounts sheets must be forwarded to the EANO Executive board through the EANO offices on return of the applicant to his/her home institution.

The period of time spent in the host institution will be not less than one month and not more than one year in duration. On termination of the project/visit the applicant will provide EANO with a full report on the project/visit, which may be published on the EANO website or in one of EANO's publications. In addition, any published works which result in part or *in toto* from the results facilitated through the EANO Fellowship will acknowledge support by inclusion of "supported by an EANO Fellowship".

Conditions

1. The applicant shall be under 35 years of age at the time of receipt of the application by EANO.
2. EANO Fellowships are open to European clinicians, scientific researchers, pathologists and nurses working in a neuro-oncology-related discipline acceptable to the EANO Executive Board.
3. The applicant is not funded by a pharmaceutical company in his/her work.
4. The project/visit for which the Fellowship is granted is to be carried out without interruption.
5. The applicant is required to take out appropriate health insurance for the duration of the project and is liable for all other mandatory local regulations regarding insurance.
6. EANO will appoint a European Tutor (normally from within the EANO Executive or Scientific Boards) to monitor the progress of the project/visit (applicants should be aware that the Tutor may visit the applicant and/or host at any time during the Fellowship period).
7. The applicant is aware that they represent EANO during the course of their Fellowship and should seek to foster excellence in the advancement of neuro-oncology and behave in a professional manner.
8. No language barrier should exist between the applicant and hosts which would impede the successful outcome of the project/visit.
9. The host institute has expertise in the diagnosis, treatment or research of CNS tumours or in the care of patients suffering from such tumours. The host institute should demonstrate evidence of their training programmes, clinical neuro-oncology involvement or scientific output within the discipline of neuro-oncology.
10. EANO reserves the right to withhold funds should it become apparent that the applicant is in receipt of funding to cover costs of the project/visit from other sources.
